Then Job answered the LORD: <sup>2</sup>‘I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted. <sup>3</sup>‘Who is this that hides counsel without knowledge?’ Therefore I have uttered what I did not understand, things too wonderful for me, which I did not know. <sup>4</sup>‘Hear, and I will speak; I will question you, and you declare to me.’ <sup>5</sup>I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you; <sup>6</sup>therefore I despise myself, and repent in dust and ashes.” <sup>10</sup>And the LORD restored the fortunes of Job when he had prayed for his friends; and the LORD gave Job twice as much as he had before. <sup>11</sup>Then there came to him all his brothers and sisters

<sup>23</sup> Furthermore, the former priests were many in number,  
because they were prevented by death from continuing in  
office; <sup>24</sup> but he holds his priesthood permanently, because he  
continues forever. <sup>25</sup> Consequently he is able for all time to  
save those who approach God through him, since he always  
lives to make intercession for them. <sup>26</sup> For it was fitting that  
we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled,  
separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. <sup>27</sup>  
Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer  
sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for
