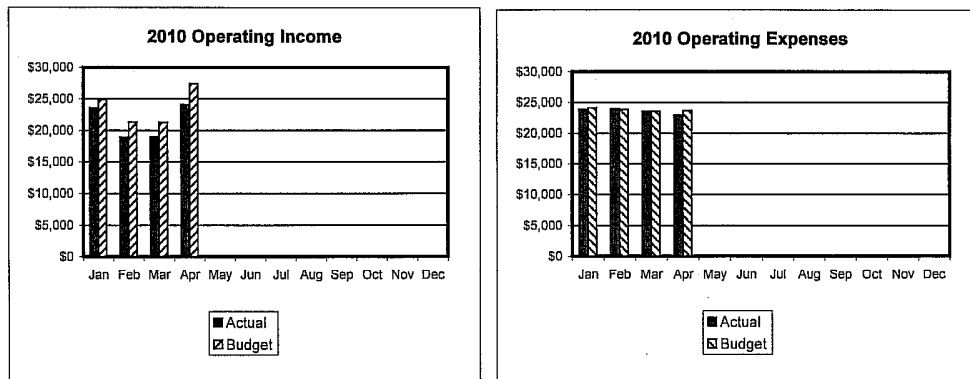

**NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

**April 2010**



**OPERATING INCOME:**

Total Income for **Apr** of **\$24,100** was **\$3,300 (12.0%)** below budget. **Regular and Special Envelopes** were **\$4,200 (19.6%)** below budget

Year to date (YTD) Total Income of **\$85,700** is **\$9,200 (9.7%)** below budget and **\$11,700 (12.0%)** less than last year at this time.

**OPERATING EXPENSES:**

Total Operating Expenses for **Apr** of **\$22,900** were **\$700 (3.1%)** below budget. The YTD total of **\$94,400** is **\$800 (0.8%)** under budget and **\$6,600 (6.5%)** less than last year at this time.

**Noteworthy items included the following:**

- The final cost for painting walls in the C.E. Building (entry, washrooms, upper hall) and Church (Rector's Vestry, Undercroft) was **\$2,526** (paint & supplies only). This was covered by the **Jessie Kerfoot Account**
- The final cost of the roof was **\$87,166**. This was paid with funds from the **Helen Baxter Account \$79,665**, the **David Wilson Memorial Fund \$6,501** and a contribution from the **St. Barnabas Scouts \$1,000**.

**SUMMARY:**

Envelope Receipts continue to be down from 2009 (10.4%) and lower than budget (12.6%). Results to the end of April show a Net Loss of \$8,700. This is \$8,300 behind Budget. As a result, the Forecast to the end of the year is now for a Net Loss of \$18,200. We pray for increased financial health as we serve God's people.
