**Pennies for Peace:** On Sunday, January 29<sup>th</sup>, the Sunday School will be hosting special guests from the Afghan-Canadian Students' Association from the University of Calgary. The ACSA students will briefly address the congregation and will then give a special cultural presentation to the Sunday school students downstairs. Parents are invited to join us. They are also raising money for school supplies and books for children in Afghanistan – a table will be set up during the coffee hour for information and donations.

**Choir:** One of the Features of St Barnabas Anglican Church is the abundance of music which accompanies the liturgy each week. It has been this way for many years, at least the twenty five years that I have been here. We are blessed with a **fine organ** and a particularly fine **instrumentalist and choir director** in Margaret. Together, with a number of **dedicated volunteers**, that make up our choir. These ingredients go together to give us some very pleasant Sundays.

It goes without saying then that if any one of these three ingredients is missing, then the show does not go on. We are now approaching this situation. With Lent and Easter just around the corner we need to do something to ensure that the show does go on. I am speaking about singers. In the past we have asked for additional choir members, hoping to encourage willing volunteers to join our choir. We have received a variety of reasons but we suspect that the main one is that they **do not wish to make a permanent commitment**.

This time we are taking a different approach. We are trying to encourage some of you to become **Seasonal Choir Members**. By this I mean give us a few weeks of your valuable time and join us for Advent and Christmas, or in this case Lent and Easter.

Margaret intends to start rehearsing Lent and Easter music on Thursday February 2nd. That would give us just ten weeks to prepare and present a variety of choral music. After Easter Day you would be free once again to return to the congregation.

We know that there are good voices out there, we hear you during the service and at sing-alongs downstairs in the church hall. You will enjoy it and we will give you all the help you will require to make the experience easy and pleasurable. Not all of our choir members read music if that's what is worrying you. We rehearse here in the chancel each Thursday evening at 7.30pm for two hours. Most of our music is sung in four part harmony so we will find a place for you that suits your voice.

Please will you consider giving up some of your time to helping our choir.
