**1<sup>st</sup> Reading: 2 Kings 13:14-20** <sup>14</sup> Now when Elisha had fallen sick with the illness of which he was to die, King Joash of Israel went down to him, and wept before him, crying, "My father, my father! The chariots of Israel and its horsemen!" <sup>15</sup> Elisha said to him, "Take a bow and arrows"; so he took a bow and arrows. <sup>16</sup> Then he said to the king of Israel, "Draw the bow"; and he drew it. Elisha laid his hands on the king's hands. <sup>17</sup> Then he said, "Open the window eastward"; and he opened it. Elisha said, "Shoot"; and he shot. Then he said, "The LORD's arrow of victory, the arrow of victory over Aram! For you shall fight the Arameans in Aphek until you have made an end of them." <sup>18</sup> He continued, "Take the arrows"; and he took them. He said to the king of Israel, "Strike the ground with them"; he struck three times, and stopped. <sup>19</sup> Then the man of God was angry with him, and said, "You should have struck five or six times; then you would have struck down Aram until you had made an end of it, but now you will strike down Aram only three times." <sup>20</sup> So Elisha died, and they buried him. Now bands of Moabites used to invade the land in the spring of the year.

**ALL: Thanks be to God**

**Psalm 28:1-9** To you, O LORD, I call; my rock, do not refuse to hear me, for if you are silent to me, I shall be like those who go down to the Pit. <sup>2</sup> **Hear the voice of my supplication, as I cry to you for help, as I lift up my hands toward your most holy sanctuary.** <sup>3</sup> Do not drag me away with the wicked, with those who are workers of evil, who speak peace with their neighbors, while mischief is in their hearts. <sup>4</sup> **Repay them according to their work, and according to the evil of their deeds; repay them according to the work of their hands; render them their due reward.** <sup>5</sup> Because they do not regard the works of the LORD, or the work of his hands, he will break them down and build them up no more. <sup>6</sup> **Blessed be the LORD, for he has heard the sound of my pleadings.** <sup>7</sup> The LORD is my strength and my shield; in him my heart trusts; so I am helped, and my heart exults, and with my song I give thanks to him. <sup>8</sup> **The LORD is the strength of his people; he is the saving refuge of his anointed.** <sup>9</sup> O save your people, and bless your heritage; be their shepherd, and carry them forever.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: Colossians 3:1-11** So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. <sup>2</sup> Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, <sup>3</sup> for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. <sup>4</sup> When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory. <sup>5</sup> Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). <sup>6</sup> On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. <sup>7</sup> These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. <sup>8</sup> But now you must get rid of all such things-- anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. <sup>9</sup> Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices <sup>10</sup> and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. <sup>11</sup> In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

**Gospel: Luke 12:13-21** <sup>13</sup> Someone in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me." <sup>14</sup> But he said to him, "Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?" <sup>15</sup> And he said to them, "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." <sup>16</sup> Then he told them a parable: "The land of a rich man produced abundantly. <sup>17</sup> And he thought to himself, 'What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?' <sup>18</sup> Then he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. <sup>19</sup> And I will say to my soul, 'Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry.' <sup>20</sup> But God said to him, 'You fool!
