Take up your cross; let not its weight fill your weak should with vain alarm; his strength shall bear your spirit up. and brace your heart, and nerve your arm.

Draw near with faith. Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his blood which he shed for you. Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving. **Amen**

Ongoing AED Project: We have launched a year-long fundraising initiative for an automated external defibrillator (AED) to have for use at the church. AEDs are small portable devices which can deliver an electric shock to a person's heart to allow it to return to a normal beating rhythm. A combination of CPR and an AED could be lifesaving for a member of our

congregation, or a member of the community who uses our space. The device costs between \$1,300 and \$3,000, and often includes training which we could offer to parishioners. If you are interested in donating, please earmark your contributions to specify that they are for the AED fund.

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
